



## Tom Daugherty Wins First Major Title in Guaranteed Rate PBA World Championship

Defeats Jakob Butturff in the championship match to win \$100,000

Jupiter, Fla. — No. 1 seed Tom Daugherty rolled a 263 game in the title match to win the Guaranteed Rate PBA World Championship for his third career PBA Tour title and first major. In the highest scoring match of the stepladder finals, Daugherty and third seed Jakob Butturff combined to roll 18 strikes, 10 of which belonged

to Daugherty on the way to a six-pin margin of victory.

“To shoot 260 to win a major is just awesome,” said Daugherty, whose most recent title came in the 2016 PBA Wolf Open. “I felt a little snake bitten on TV. I knew I needed to keep getting there to give myself more opportunities. Finally, I broke through with one.”

The first to finish the match,

Daugherty needed two strikes and four pins in the 10th frame to shut out Butturff and clinch victory. His first strike was exactly what he wanted to do. The next one, he admits, required luck as he rolled the 2 pin to strike and, after a nine count on the fill ball, ultimately win.

“You always want to shut your guy out,” said Daugherty. “Getting the first one was key and I threw the best shot I possibly could. I aced it. I lost control of the second one. I realized it was the moment that would make me a major champion and everything started to speed up. It was my worst shot of the match, but I had the right ball in the right part of the lane and I got lucky.”

Daugherty’s second strike in the 10th frame was his

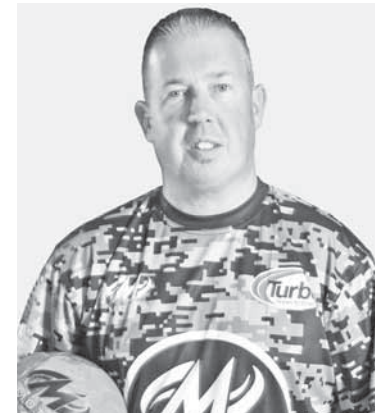

The William Penn men and Baker women went undefeated in double-elimination match play to record wins in their respective divisions at the Heart of American Conference Tournament.

The two-day event was held in Keokuk, Iowa, and featured six teams in each division. All teams bowled 28 Baker games to determine seeding for the bracket, with the top two teams receiving a first-round bye.

Each match in the brackets leading up the finals featured a best-of-five Baker format, with the finals moving to best-of-seven.

In the men's division, William Penn cruised to the top seed, finishing with a 5,557 total. Baker earned the second bye with 5,294.

William Penn defeated Culver-Stockton (3-0) and Grand View (3-2) to earn its spot in the final. Grand View bounced back with a 3-1 win in the elimination bracket against Culver-Stockton to set up a rematch against the Statesmen.

The title tilt came down to the deciding game, with

William Penn collecting the victory, 4-3.

Baker earned the top seed in the women's division, posting a 4,867 total. Clarke edged William Penn for the second position by 20 pins, finishing with 4,829.

After the first-round bye, Baker rolled through Grand View (3-1) and Clarke (3-0) to advance to the title match. William Penn won two matches in the elimination bracket to also advance to the final, including a 3-1 victory in a rematch against Clarke.

Baker recorded a 4-2 win in the finals against William Penn to claim the title.

In other collegiate action:  
- At the Columbia 300 Music City Classic in Smyrna, Tennessee, the top-seeded McKendree women defeated Nebraska in the bracket final, 4.5-1.5.

## Francois Lavoie, The Face-Masked Crusader Of Bowling

If you met Francois Lavoie in person at your local bowling center, you would probably be reminded of a resigned, shy character reminiscent of Bruce Wayne, the alter ego of Batman, rather than the famous Caped Crusader of comic book and motion picture fame.

The quiet, unassuming professional bowler from Quebec City, QC, weighs in at a mere 128 pounds distributed on a chiseled 5'6" frame (for those of you in Canada - that's 58 kg in weight and 170 cm in height). But what Lavoie lacks in stature, he more than makes up for with his intense

the ideas was a PBA Films, administered by NFL Films, a regular weekly PBA recap show on ESPN, appearing in music videos (like Rockstar by Nickelback) a bowler hosting "Saturday Night Live," bowlers making cameo appearances on prime-time sitcoms, dramas, and daytime and primetime talk shows.

But a situation comedy based on the life of a professional bowler? Never even entered my mind, that's why I read the press release three times before it full registered. After it did sink in, the steps to this process came to mind.

To get a show to air, a one-page treatise gets pitched to different networks and programmers. If it sounds feasible, a sample or pilot episode is ordered.

Keep in mind there are many treatments and ideas that don't get beyond this point, but here's where the original treatment can change once a test audience reacts to it at the recording of the pilot episode.

As an example of tweaking a story idea, go find the original pilot of "The Big Bang Theory" (TBBT) on YouTube. As you will see in several different scenes (individual scenes are all that's available right now), it doesn't look like the one that lasted twelve seasons. After test audiences viewed it, Chuck

Lorre and Warner Brothers got feedback on what characters were watchable and which ones weren't. The original lead female character was not anything like Kaley Cuoco's "Penny," nor was Johnny Galecki's "Leonard."

According to Lorre in a CBS This Morning piece the week of TBBT's final episode, the lead female, named Katie, had a much darker and more edgy personality, something CBS and test audiences didn't like. Cuoco was hired to play "Penny," whom producers, the network, and the test audience for the second pilot liked. That pilot became Episode #1 of the most popular sitcom in the last ten years.

Granted an industry icon like Lorre gets projects green lit without much process nowadays, if you look back in his prior sitcoms, edgier characters were his trademark.

One fear is I'm hoping bowling and its athletes get better treatment than Hollywood has given it in the past. As many of us know, time in the gym is essential for many success stories on today's PBA Tour. The beer bellied dude look doesn't cut it anymore. If this show does make it to air and does take off, in one way this could be the best PR campaign the PBA has ever had. Cameo appearances from the bowlers, believable story lines, and bowling gets something it has never had, weekly exposure on network primetime television. The

producers who brought us the Matt LeBlanc lead "Man With A Plan" are spearheading this effort. I'll pass along any tidbits Smallwood is able to disclose as this plays out. Stay tuned.

World Series of Bowling XII action is not over for Daugherty, who will team with BJ Moore to bowl for the PBA Roth/Holman Doubles Championship title tomorrow at 3 p.m. ET on Fox Sports' FS1.

Tuesday and Wednesday, Daugherty will compete in match play for the PBA Chameleon Championship and PBA Scorpion Championship, giving him two more opportunities to win at the World Series in his native Tampa.

"I get to bowl in my hometown in one of my favorite centers," said Daugherty. "I'm going to try to make the most of it."

My only exposure with bowling in Canada was in the province of Ontario, where I was involved in a few remodels and grand openings of new facilities for AMF in the 1980's. The one that I remember most was the Grand Reopening of O'Connor Bowl West in suburban Toronto, the precursor to all of the remodels that took place (and continue to take place) in the United States, thanks to the efforts of the Bowlero Corporation and others.

But my fondest memories are at the Grand Opening of Southland Bowl, where the general manager (and professional bowler), Conn Casey, specified that he wanted me to be a part of the festivities; and to roll against my childhood hero, Dick Weber, in an exhibition match. As I reported in a previous article for this publication, Weber "allowed"

me to win the match by a few pins (658-647), something that I'm sure he did for me on more than one occasion... including a couple of ties! (Yes, he was that good!).

In addition to the face-mask mandate that could be providing Francois with an enormous

amount of encouragement, I also wonder if the Canadian government might be a source of his attentiveness. You see, in Canada, the government income tax is exorbitant when compared to the United States — and especially in Lavoie's home province of Quebec.

While no one likes paying taxes, just take a look at these statistics provided by a computer search of taxes in Quebec, Ontario, and Wichita, Kansas, where Mr. Lavoie now resides. was the many Bob's Business July all day trade shows at old Willowbrook Lanes in suburban Chicago. Booths were set up on the center's concourse, numerous national touring pros demonstrated their company's new fall line of balls, and the afternoon ball talk session with the man himself. At my

first Bob's show, I was on the concourse after lunch when the concourse crowd thinned out and got suddenly quiet. After someone said, "Mo's started his seminar," I ventured downstairs and saw attendees and pros alike in the hallway and bottom of the stairwell leaning forward to catch every new idea.

Since he was recognizable and knew every touring pro at the show, it turned at times into a panel discussion of what ball and layout he suggested for so and so then have the pro explain what he saw for that successful qualifying block, match play block, or television

finals. Mo would break down what the coverstock did, the core did, how the bowler rolled it and the approach moves he made. This was definitely not a seminar of a man peddling snake oil. No way would anyone nod off in one of these, no chance.

If you had a ball motion question, he would answer it in a way to make sure the light above your head turned on,

making sure you fully understood his point. This will be just a small part of his legacy. Rest In Peace, Mo, and thank you for sharing your insight.

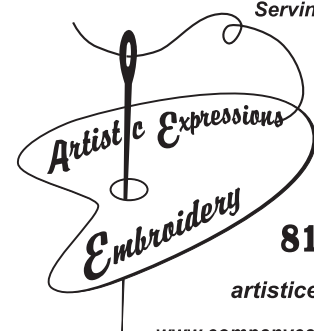

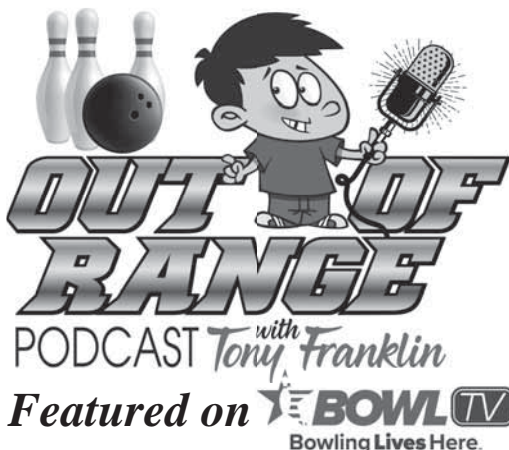
