Belmonte Beats Simonsen to Win Third Consecutive PBA World Championship Title

LAS VEGAS (March 15, 2020) - In a match-up between two of the Go Bowling PBA Tour's premier two-handed players, Australian Jason Belmonte defeated Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas,

213-190, in the title match Sunday at the South Point Bowling Plaza to win his third consecutive PBA World Championship title while extending his all-time career-leading major win total to 13.

Bowling in front of an on-site finals audience that consisted of mainly PBA players, their family members and tournament officials held three days earlier than originally scheduled, Belmonte also notched his 24th career PBA Tour title to take home the \$150,000 first prize.

The PBA modified plans for all of the Storm PBA World

Series of Bowling XI finals telecasts in response to the coronavirus pandemic, moving the live FS1 World Championship telecast to Sunday from its original Wednesday (March 18) slot while also postponing all additional competition in the three animal pattern (lane condition) championships. However, the players were able to complete all 56 games of qualifying and match play for the World Championship last week to advance to the finals.

As the top seed for the finals, Belmonte also added to his ever-growing list of accomplishments in PBA majors joining Hall of Famer Earl Anthony as the only players to win three consecutive World Championship titles. Anthony did it twice when the event was called the **PBA National Championship** ('73, '74, '75 and '81, '82 and 83). Belmonte, the five-time and reigning PBA Player of the Year, was also making a record fifth consecutive major telecast appearance and eight of the last

What made the win extra special for Belmonte was that he won in front of his entire family for the first time.

USBC Postpones National Events until May 1

By: Terry Bigham ARLINGTON, Texas - The **United States Bowling Congress** (USBC) is postponing or suspending nationally con-ducted USBC events until May 1, 2020, due to COVID-19 safety

This includes the USBC Open Championships, USBC Women's Championships, USBC Convention, USBC Masters and USBC Senior Queens. USBC made this difficult decision out of concern for the health and safety of our members, their families and local communities.

• The 2020 USBC Open Championships and 2020 USBC Women's Championships are suspended until May 1, 2020. All teams registered from March 21 through April 30 will have the option to reschedule for new added dates in the summer. USBC customer service will contact team captains directly with more details.

• The USBC Masters, USBC Senior Queens and USBC Convention are postponed indefinitely. USBC intends to reschedule these events later in 2020, as public health conditions allow.

USBC will announce any changes to the Professional Women's Bowling Association





(PWBA) Tour schedule no later than April 2, 2020.

We realize our stakeholders will have many questions related the changes. USBC staff is working on additional communications and guidance for our bowlers and association leaders. We appreciate everyone's patience as our staff works to provide more information as soon as possible.

Belmonte's Super Slam Seals February IBMA Bowler of the Month

ARLINGTON. TX - Jason Belmonte, Orange, New South Wales, Australia, has been selected as the February 2020 Kegel Bowler of the Month by the International Bowling Media Association.

Belmonte defeated Anthony Simonsen, Little Elm, Texas, 226 to 201, for the 2020 U.S. Open title, his 23rd overall PBA career title and a record 12th

major title.

In the television stepladder finals, fifth seed Perry Crowell IV, Hoquiam, Washington, outlasted fourth seed Chris Via, Springfield, Ohio, 241 to 203. The third seed Dick Allen, Columbia, South Carolina downed Crowell IV, 205 to 181, and the second seed Belmonte ousted Allen, 215 to 187, to set up the final match with the top seed Simonsen.

With the U.S. Open win, Belmonte became the second bowler to claim the Super Slam, joining PBA and USBC Hall of Famer Mike Aulby to win all five majors.

Besides the U.S. Open, both players have won the Tournament of Champions, PBA World Championship, USBC Masters, and PBA Players Championship. In addition, both Aulby and Belmonte have rolled nationally televised 300 games on PBA telecasts.

Others obtaining votes this month were Bill O'Neill, winner of the PBA Players Championship, Kris Prather, winner of the PBA Tournament of Champions, Kyle Troup, winner of the PBA Greater Jonesboro Open, Jesper Svensson, winner of the PBA Indianapolis Open,

and Tom Hess, winner of the Greater Iowa Bowling Association Ebonite Winter Classic.

Just Paying Attention

Over a 24-hour period last week everything changed, just like that.

Once news broke last week Wednesday, March 11, the Houston Livestock and Rodeo show was being shut down, you started to think how far up the line the cancellations and postponements would go. For readers not in Texas, it's a three week party in March, of daytime rodeo and livestock shows with nighttime concerts of 80,000 at NRG Stadium. It's very much a signature event to the region.

By this point we had also heard from PBA CEO Colie Edison stating the Storm World Series of Bowling XI would continue with live television finals this week, Sunday through Wednesday, taking the edge off what was going on around us, near and far.

Then, the trickle started. But it wasn't until we heard about **Utah jazz center Rudy Gobert** and the test results he will be associated with for the rest of his life when "What If" turned into "When." It was only a matter of time and what unthinkable scale of what would be suspended, delayed, postponed

or outright cancelled. Later on Friday March 13, Edison announced the PBA World Championship finals would be held Sunday March 15, with the animal pattern finals rescheduled at a later time.

Considering the bulk of events and their postseason schedule, the timing could not have been worse. Winter sports seasons are finishing up, spring sports seasons have begun, others are somewhere in between.

Things had been a little precarious at this point early last Wednesday, March 11. ľ had been in contact with two, area college bowling coaches wondering if their institutions were going to allow their teams to travel to sectionals. A handful of schools across the country had already enacted self-quarantine policies, banning travel for any school group anywhere for the foreseeable future.

One coach said she was taking her team to their conference meet, the other was still planning to go to sectionals. During its final practice before leaving the next morning, the second coach learned there was an emergency meeting of his

school's administration taking place at the same time. The coach already had the paperwork signing out two vans for Thursday morning. The assembled team members would be together learning their season's fate at a bowling center, albeit huddled around the coach's cell phone rather than finishing a competition.

Another team starting its post season run was McKendree University, one of the powerhouse programs of college bowling. Head Women's Coach Shannon O'Keefe was getting ready to take her Lady Bearcats to Stardust Bowl in suburban Chicago on Thursday. The two-time reigning PWBA Player of the Year was kind enough to offer JPA comments literally after the news broke before they were scheduled to depart campus.

JPA: What had you heard from the AD or the administration about self-imposed travel bans as other schools had already implemented in the last few weeks?

Coach O'Keefe: At the time of sectionals being canceled, our school had not implemented any travel bans. We all had mass amounts of tissue, disinfectant wipes, Lysol spray, and hand sanitizer. We are all very aware of the importance of health and good hygiene

JPA: How did the team take the news? Must have been tough, especially the seniors.

Coach O'Keefe: Well, we weren't with them when we found out, we knew it was a possibility and had been preparing them, what we weren't prepared for was for their NCAA National Championship to be canceled. That was completely devastating! I'm sure the girls are upset, as we have a group message going and I can feel their heartbreak.

I'm so grateful that the last time this current team was ever able to compete together, they won the last NCAA regular season event, and were ranked #1 in the country. We will always have amazing memories as a team. I'm hurting for them, having a hard time holding it together, this was not the way seniors were supposed to end their careers, and I'm so devastated for them.

JPA: Is there anything in Scripture to offer?

Coach O'Keefe: Although it hurts and we don't understand it, and it's not the way things were "supposed" to happen for all seniors. I believe with my entire being that God's plan is always greater than ours, even when it doesn't make sense or align with ours plans. I pray for

everyone's health, and that everyone finds comfort. I pray for those seniors, who will never put on their collegiate jerseys again, will be able to hold their heads high and be grateful for their journey through athletics, that they can be proud of all they've learned and accomplished and more importantly, who they've become.

JPA: Do you have a final gathering of the season, like a team party to say goodbye and thanks to the seniors?

Coach O'Keefe: We normally don't because the PWBA Tour starts right after (the ITC finals), but we will now and give them some closure.

As I was messaging with O'Keefe, she added the following message on her own Facebook page.





'We know that the high school bowlers have been practicing diligently so that they may have the chance to claim the Texas High School Bowling Club (THSBC) championship. But, the overall health of our bowlers, coaches, and families is the number one priority of the THSBC board.

COVID-19 is a very contagious virus that we would all like to see be eradicated quickly. But to do so we need to eliminate the spread of the disease. Therefore, after strong consideration, the THSBC board has decided to cancel the State tournament, as well as the All District tournament. This decision was made in part by the San Antonio and Bexar County ban on events drawing more than 500 people; the UIL decision not to have state championship events for sports and academics; and the **USBC** suspension of all national



The finals will still be conducted with an audience limited to fellow players, family members and tournament officials.

3) FS1 will air the finals live on Sunday at 1:30 p.m. Eastern (10:30 a.m. Pacific) instead of next Wednesday, as originally planned.

4) A decision on the PBA's 2020 competition points race, affecting the field of player who will qualify for the PBA Playoffs, will be announced

5) The PBA League Draft, scheduled for Sunday afternoon, also has been postponed and will be conducted at a later date.

The PBA announcement Friday comes on the heels of USBC's announcement Thursday that the USBC Masters, originally scheduled for March 23-29 in Reno, has been postponed indefinitely.

my family here to see this," said the 36-year-old Australian, whose wife Kimberly, son Hugo, and daughters Sylvie and Aria were in attendance to witness the victory. "They were a calming influence when I wasn't doing well and a great support structure overall. It was a dream to have them here

to see this."

It was also Belmonte's second consecutive major title this season after winning the U.S. Open on Feb. 23 to join PBA Hall of Famer Mike Aulby as the only players to complete the PBA Tour's Super Slam, which is a title in all five PBA majors (PBA Tournament of Champions, U.S. Open, PBA Players Championship, **USBC Masters and PBA World** Championship). It was in the

2019 World Championship that Belmonte won his 11th major to surpass Hall of Famers Pete Weber and Earl Anthony on the all-time major titles list.

In the title match, the 23-year-old Simonsen, trying to become the youngest player to win three majors, got off to a bad start with two opens after leaving difficult splits. Belmonte was able to take advantage by stringing strikes from the third through seventh frames which gave him enough of a cushion to win the match.

"Going into the match it was all going to be about speed control," Belmonte said. "Keeping it slow and getting a good consistent release was the key. Anytime you can keep striking, keep a big lead and your opponent believes he has to strike out to win, that's when you can really keep the pressure on."

The World Championship was the fourth and final event of the season that offered a \$1 million bonus if the winning player bowled a 300 game in the title match.

"Obviously you can't ignore the money in a tournament like this but it's never been the motivating factor for me," said Belmonte. "It's always about the title because that's what

Lavoie, the No. 4 seed, beating three-time Team USA member and former National Amateur Champion No. 5 seed Chris Via of Springfield, Ohio, 269-258 to advance to the second match against Simonsen. Via, a two-time PBA Tour runner-up, finished fifth to match his best

finish in a major which came in the recent U.S. Open.
