# **Jamie Brooks Becomes 24th** Member of 100,000-Pin Club at USBC Open Championships



Jamie Brooks - 100,000 Pins

LAS VEGAS - Jamie Brooks of McKinney, Texas, waited long enough for his chance to become a member of the 100,000-Pin Club at the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships.

When the May 1 start date for the 2021 event was finalized, he was among the first in line to lock in his dates and times, which he hoped would be close to the beginning of the event, so he could complete a journey that was six decades in the making.

Brooks was able to register for the second day of the tournament, and he etched his name in the tournament record book again Sunday when he toppled his 100,000th pin during the final game of his team event at the South Point **Bowling Plaza.** 


The 86-year-old right-hander needed just about every frame of his three games to collect the 381 pins he needed for the milestone, and he did it in dramatic fashion, entertaining the small crowd of spectators allowed to be on-hand since some recent changes in the COVID-19 protocols and procedures.

Brooks opened the set with a 154 effort and then struggled on the way to a 121 game.

In the finale, he stepped up in the eighth frame needing just nine pins to become the 24th bowler in tournament history to eclipse the 100,000-pin mark. He left the 4-7 combination on his first offering and made the spare to cross the special threshold.

100,000 career pins knocked down at the USBC Open Championships, does that seem like a tall task, well it is, a very tall task. You only get nine games per year to add to your total, so that means that IF you average 200 every game, it takes 56 years...and that's a really big IF.

Jamie Brooks, proprietor extraordinaire, is now in that club, and it took him 61 years to accomplish the goal and join the club as the 24th member.

You have to be good, you have to be consistent, and most importantly, you have to stay healthy to knock over that many pins in the Open Championship.

Brooks knocked over his 100,000th pin by sparing the 4-7 in the 8th frame of his third team game on Sunday. His team score was 440, probably not exactly the score he wanted, but what he really wanted was to get the chance to step into bowling immortality. And he did just that.

Surrounded by friends and family, there were two other Plano Super Bowl teams bowling beside him, wife Peggy in the stands, industry friends

in the audience, and even a surprise appearance by PBA Superstar Anthony Simonsen, who grew up bowling at Jamie's Plano center.

Scott Craddock, who has worked for Jamie as the GM at Plano Super Bowl for the last eight years, was also in attendance yesterday.

"There were a lot of bowlers from other squads that showed up to watch and the buzz started as soon as he got close," he said.

"You will not see this many times and that's why I was here, to see it live was what I wanted. The accomplishment is really hard to put into words. I think it was really relief for Jamie, he set a goal to get this when he was 15,000 pins away, and you could tell that his arm swing really loosened up after he passed 100,000," Craddock added.

Marshall Medlin, a close friend and USBC teammate with Brooks for the last 10 years had a front row seat to history.

"It was the most intense moment I have ever felt, wanting him to get the pins he needed, and one of the most exhilarating moments when he spared the 4-7 to secure it," said

'In the locker room before we went out, everybody was just encouraging him and told him to relax and enjoy the moment, but he was more relaxed than we were," he added.

Joining Brooks on Sunday evening on the lanes were the rest of the Cowtown Bowling Palace team of Medlin, Leon Aragon, Ricky Roberts, and Bill Ferguson. It may be an individual accomplishment, but the value of good friends has strong importance too.

I was honored to be on a team with him; most of the team has been with him longer than I have, but it was great to be a part of history. To be able to turn around and see the smile on (wife) Peggy's face, brought it all together," said Marshall.

This is EXACTLY what makes bowling so special. If this isn't the true definition of a lifetime sport, then nothing is.

The fact that so many people come together to support a friend eclipse a career milestone is what it's all about. I think we all have done the math and recognize that this milestone isn't for everybody, its rarified air that these 24 bowlers live in and we are lucky to witness the greatness.

Congrats Jamie, well done sir, well done.



There have been five perfect games rolled in championship rounds on the PWBA Tour, with the last being achieved at the 2019 Pepsi PWBA Louisville Open by Ukraine's Dasha Kovalova. Kovalova's 300 game was against Johnson in the title

"They were brutal earlier today, and after talking to my ball reps, we tried something out," said Johnson, who rolled her first 300 in a championshipround appearance during the title match of the 2001 Paula Carter Classic. "I wanted to take a ball and put some surface on it to see how it looked from the outside part of the lane. It was the same ball I had used most of the week. but from different angles. I was fortunate to find the right combination.

# 2021 USBC Virtual Convention and **Annual Meeting Come to a Close**

ARLINGTON, Texas – **United States Bowling Congress** delegates elected three board members and voted on 19 legislative proposals from 2020 and 2021, as the 2021 USBC Virtual **Convention and Annual Meet**ing came to a close Thursday.

The ballot for the USBC **Board of Directors election** had five candidates slated by the USBC Nominating Committee - Jay Daryman of York, Pennsylvania; Dennis Hacker of Longtown, Missouri; Johnny Harris of Lynchburg, Virginia; Chrissy Lee of Tampa, Florida; and Jonathan Van Hees of Hope Valley, Rhode Island - with candidate Sue Schreiber of Medford, Wisconsin, running from the floor.

On the first ballot, Lee (437 votes), Hacker (378) and Daryman (351) were elected, with Schreiber receiving 333 votes, Van Hees receiving 232 votes and Harris receiving 158 votes.

A candidate had to receive a majority of votes from the 642 votes cast to be elected. The newly elected board members will begin their three-year terms on Aug. 1, 2021.

The delegates also ratified the 2020 appointments of Adam Mitchell of Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, Glenda Beckett of Palmetto Bay, Florida, and Tina Williams of Pflugerville, Texas,

to the USBC Board.

Becky Young of McDonough, Georgia, and Dicki Ward of Oklahoma City will be joining the International Bowling Campus Youth Committee, which also returns current members Blair Blumenscheid of Harrisville. Utah. and Chad Estes of Statesville, North Carolina.

In addition to the board elections, delegates voted on proposals from 2020 and 2021 amendments, with six related to league rules, five for tournament rules and eight proposals for bylaws.

The 2020 USBC Convention and Annual Meeting were canceled in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Delegates approved of a

league rule amendment that allows a league officer to authorize practice if a game or series is interrupted. One amendment to national bylaws was approved, which provides for the board to make emergency decisions, in extreme situations, to temporarily suspend bylaws and rules.

Two local associations also were recognized and celebrated based on their outstanding performance and service to their members. The Sioux Falls Regional USBC of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, and Fort Collins USBC of Fort Collins, Colorado, were selected for the USBC **Association Excellence Awards** for 2020 and 2021, respectively.



# USBC Announces Governance Adjustments, Including Minimum Age for Adult Membership and Increased Team USA Athlete Representation on National Board

ARLINGTON, Texas - The **United States Bowling Congress** Board of Directors has approved a series of governance policy amendments for next season.

The amendments include an increase in the number of Team USA athletes on the USBC Board of Directors to meet new requirements from the United **States Olympic & Paralympic** Committee.

As part of that change, USBC received approval from USOPC to expand its definition of a

Team USA athlete eligible for board service to include team members who earned their status through the USBC Team USA Trials.

Other amendments impact youth governance, including limiting USBC Adult membership to individuals 18 and older. This change is designed to better align with U.S. Center for SafeSport policies related to adult and minor participation.

An amendment removing the requirement for designated

youth directors from USBC local and state boards also was approved. Starting next season, all state and local board members will be referred to as directors.

The USBC Board of Directors has authority in the USBC bylaws to adopt changes to the **USBC** General Playing Rules and amend bylaws in regard to athlete and youth issues.

The new amendments will go into effect Aug. 1, 2021. Click on each item to read the full proposal of the amendment:

- A new addition to Rule 16 in the USBC General Playing Rules, which limits adult membership to individuals 18 and older and creates a clear line between USBC Youth and USBC Adult membership.
- · The removal of youth directors from the bylaws of merged local and state USBC associations. All participants on local and state boards of directors will be referred to as directors.
- A change to the number of board members for the

**USBC** Board of Directors to comply with USOPC bylaws, which now require 33.3% of the members to be considered athlete representation.

o An increase in the number of Team USA athletes

o Changes "Other Directors" to an "Amateur Sports Organization Director" specific requirements

o Decreases the number of at-large directors

· An expansion of the definition of a Team USA athlete.

# **USBC SMART Program Makes \$7 Million Earning Allocation**

**Proposes Policy Revisions to Deliver More Scholarship Funds to Youth Bowlers**

ARLINGTON, Texas - The Scholarship Management and **Account Reporting for Tenpins** (SMART) program is making an investment earnings allocation of \$7 million to provide additional scholarships for youth bowlers. The \$7 million allocation is the largest investment earnings allocation in SMART history and will be designated as Unassigned funds for Providers to use for scholarships.

In addition to announcing the \$7 million allocation for SMART Provider use, the **USBC SMART Committee is** proposing a series of policy changes designed to increase scholarship benefits for SMART

Recipients. No policy changes are final, and all proposals will have a comment period until June 30.

The proposed policy revisions include the portion of future investment gains and expired scholarships to SMART Recipient accounts, adding bonus scholarships for those actively using SMART funds and creation of a new SMART Recipient grant program.

Proposed policy revisions for SMART Providers include requiring Providers use Unassigned funds received from SMART within two years.

The SMART program was established to safeguard and manage the scholarships awarded to USBC Youth bowl-

Since day one, a premise of JPA has been to cover bowling as if it were a major sport. Part of making the word "if" into 'is" will be how its athletes deal with adversity and outside criticism of their performances. For example, in major college sports with highly profile television coverage like basketball and football, the line of athlete comment and criticism can be a little blurry.

That line can go a little sideways when athletes are

not used to receiving much media attention. Most teams. leagues, or associations have written policy of not going public through the media when players or coaches are critical anyone else is the group or organization, and the like. Usually, such matters are handled in house, behind closed doors within the group.

After games, the head coach and different players are asked about different in-game decisions, get comments on

player performances, and provide overall game analysis. Reporters and broadcasters will relay coaches and players comments and offer their insight as seasoned observers in the next day's paper and live post game shows, also posted on the team's and media outlets including its own websites and social media.

In collegiate sports with lesser followings, the only review is by coaches followed by a box score of the game, and at times a comment from a player. How bowlers and coaches with genuinely honest and informative comments in the right forum can set an example while reducing the chance of a comment being taken out of

Three different scenarios in our little corner of the world unfolded in recent weeks. One high profile coach apologized on social media for making a strategic decision that didn't work out as planned. That's more than reasonable if the coach has made post competition comments in the past.

Such a public statement doesn't occur often, especially in social media. But this coach wanted to set the record straight and did just that.

What happens when parents and athletes are critical of a coach or coaches on social media?

This is the second of the two scenarios that has reared its head recently. Another college team has had some student athletes and their parents bash their own coach for making team members in their words, "work too hard." Most team members were quitting because they claimed the tasks and advice given them was not helping while going to the school's athletic director to complain. What these bowlers and parents don't realize is other coaches also see these comments, which

may not be repairable. The third example was Anthony Simonsen's opening match in the recent Kia PBA Playoffs. After reading social media trolling in the following 24 hours, you would have thought he took a crowbar to a ball return while being interviewed by Kimberly Pressler. From the start of the match Lil' Ant was not happy about much and let everyone watching know. From bad racks to his pin carry issues on TV the last 18 months to thinking out loud wondering if he should look for a new career, there was some issue. Then analyst Randy Pederson called him on it, stating every pro goes through dry spells even if your career to this point at age 24 has been pretty good. Pedersen added he also should be thankful for the sponsors whom have put the PBA in a position to offer the type of money they now bowl for in the last couple of years.

It didn't help Thomas Larsen spend the match in his "A" Game zone, including posting the front nine strikes in the second game on his way to a Round of 16 win. The comments, as you might expect were out of left field, and that's putting it mildly. For those new viewers or not old enough to remember Randy knows all too well of an opponent jumping onto a skillet for a mental fry during a television match.

In the semifinal match of the 1987 PBA National Championship, Pedersen rolled the front 10 strikes against Marshall Holman who had a mild meltdown, even by late 80's on TV standards. A distraction before a 3rd frame split caused Holman's attention to go sideways as Chris Schenkel tried to tastefully describe what he was seeing. Why this match, you ask? Holman had won both the Tournament of Champions and U.S. Open twice by this time and was hoping to add the National Championship for the Triple Crown in what turned out to be his only TV finals appearance in this event. You'll have to find it yourself, but it is on YouTube. This isn't the JPA Lost Classic this week, but the next item is.

You've seen the different video sites covering the major team and individual sports on YouTube. They can be downright brutal and downright happy toward athletes they feature, often at the same time. Very confusing to those unfamiliar with the sway of social media in this era. Our little corner of the world is at a point to jump into the mainstream sports world. We'd better be sure we know how to handle it.

To this point, I haven't heard anything else about the Simonsen match comments. Perhaps it has been handled in house.

To wrap up the JPA Lost Classic monthly series of Tournament of Champions finals in years ending in the number "1".



# A Couple of Bowling Legends... Ted Rebain and Chief Halftown

As this writer continued in a search of information that had been left to me by Ted Rebain, a lifelong promoter of the game of bowling, I came across an interesting association that had been arranged by Mr. Rebain during his time at Parkade Lanes in Manchester, Connecticut. This association involved a legend in television broadcasting named Chief Halftown.

Travnor Ora Halftown, also known as Chief Halftown, was born on February 24,1917. The Chief grew up in Buffalo, New York, just a few miles from his ancestral home at the Seneca Tribal Reservation, where both of his parents were born. Throughout his life he would often correct interviewers when they referred to him as the more "politically correct" anacronym of Native American, saying instead that he was a full-blooded Indian and a member of the Seneca Tribe.

As a teen, Halftown worked as a pin boy in Jamestown, New York. He would continue his association with bowling while stationed at Carlisle, Pennsylvania during World War II, competing with a three-state championship military team. Halftown was also an accomplished singer, traveling with the Buddy Wilson Band. He was featured as "The Singing Seneca."

After the war was over, Halftown went searching for singing gigs in Pennsylvania. He even recorded an album, "Chief Halftown Sings," which included hits like Lonely Wind, Sleepy Head, Goldmine in the Sky, and Dream Time (these selections can still be heard on YouTube). While Halftown admitted to a "Perry Como style of singing," this writer can't help but detect a strong similarity to Don Ho, particularly in Sleepy Head, which has the same cadence as the popular "Tiny Bubbles."

When a singing career did not pan out, Chief Halftown decided to try television and interviewed with WFIL-TV Channel 6 (later changing their call letters to the current WPVI-TV) in Philadelphia for a six week test pilot that would evolve into a 49-year children's television program - "Chief Halftown and His Friends. In order to promote the kid's television show, Halftown would make public appearances at shopping malls, carnivals, street parades, and bowling centers.

That's when a bright mind at the Brunswick Corporation decided to bring Chief Halftown onto their Advisory Staff as a showman for the game of bowling. It was not long after that when Ted Rebain, an enterprising young supervisor from the Middle Atlantic Region of the American International **Bowling Corporation (AIBC)**, invited the Chief to come and perform before a group of 350 youngsters at Parkade Lanes in Manchester, Connecticut.

Joan Rebain, Ted's wife of almost 70 years before Ted's passing in 2020, shared a humorous story with me in 2015 regarding Chief Halftown's visit to Parkade Lanes. "We arranged to meet Chief Halftown at the Hartford Airport and drive him to the bowling center in Manchester," said Joan. "As we approached within a couple of blocks of the bowling center, Chief Halftown told Ted to pull

"You're not taking me to the exhibition in this," said the Chief, referring to the Rebain's automobile. "I'm a star!" They finally agreed that Ted and Joan would leave Chief Halftown there, and have the children meet him outside the bowling center as he approached the parking lot on foot.

"The next week Ted got a nice raise from the company, and we bought a new car," Joan fondly remembered. However, that wasn't all that Ted got from his relationship with Chief Halftown, as Rebain utilized the Chief's format of instruction from that exhibition to develop bowling clubs with elementary schools for many years to follow (with or without Halftown in attendance).

In similar manner, Chief Halftown credited that Man-

chester visit as the very first "Chief Halftown Junior Bowling Club." When all was said and done, Chief Halftown had formed 256 such clubs in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Panama, Peru and 7 European countries under the auspices of the Brunswick Corporation.

#### I Left Part of My Game at Home

Ever felt that way? I arrived at a tournament once and discovered I had driven off with my left side spare game still on the table right by the door so I wouldn't forget it. It was as if I had never shot a left side spare in my life. The lane looked all off. I knew I usually stood here and threw over there but it looked all wrong and I couldn't get the feel. And then there was the time with one and half games to go and I'm the bubble, the thumb slug falls down into the thumbhole....

Maybe today is the day it feels like you're pushing every shot outside. Actually, that was in the first two games. Now it feels like you couldn't get the ball to the outside if you faced six lanes away. Whose ball is in your bag anyhow?

Stuff happens. You can rarely fix things in the heat of the battle. You'll just have to go with what you brought today. It is no different than bringing your bag into the center and opening it only to discover you've brought the wrong bag. As soon as the panic subsides (are we equipment-dependent or what?) you just move around until you find a place where the equipment you brought will work. In fact, sometimes you discover you didn't bring the wrong bag at all. What you actually brought was the wrong

Sometimes we get really stubborn and determinedly keep throwing where we WERE effective, thinking the magic

will be back in just a second. We are sure the shot was there which means it is there. Maybe not. Maybe you're throwing the same shot you were throwing and maybe you're not. The reality is that what you're doing isn't working.

The greatest lesson here is about staying in the moment. We usually think that past behavior of the ball predicts future behavior. That's like straddling two time zones instead of just being in the time zone you're in - this moment. Don't judge. Observe. This moment says that in order to get the ball to the outside you need to face six lanes away. Okay, so

At that tournament where my old dependable left side spare game was at home and consequently I had no way to make left side spares, it was time to get radical. So, radical for me at the time was to stand on the left side of the lane and throw down the boards at left side spares. After all, what was going to happen? I was going to miss? I was already doing that quite well. It felt awkward but certainly was no worse than the foreign territory of the right side of the lane. My new plan worked. Of course, it wouldn't have taken much to be an improvement. I learned about alternative thinking and panic attacks and getting in ruts and all kinds of things from that experience. You'll always learn something, even if it is only to mark your bags more carefully.

ment director Duane Hagen and **USBC** Executive Director Chad Murphy presented him with a crystal pin to commemorate the accomplishment.

Once the pressure was off, Brooks was able to deliver his first double of the event, which helped him to a 165 finish and 440 series. He entered the year with 99,619 pins and now sits at 100,059.

'You know, I've had goals all the way through my life," said Brooks, who made his first Open Championships appearance at the 1957 event in Fort Worth, Texas, also the debut of automatic pinsetters. "About 10 years ago, I knew I could get this, and the good Lord left me here long enough for me to do

Two years ago, Brooks prepared to celebrate his 60th tournament appearance, also at South Point, knowing

100,000 pins was within reach, though it would take the best all-events performance of his career. He arrived in Las Vegas needing 1,860 pins for a double milestone.

In looking at the numbers afterward, 381 pins over 60 years is less than seven pins per year. Accounting for those pins definitely crossed his mind while waiting for his return to the championship lanes, especially when he was delayed another year due to the pandemic-canceled 2020 tournament.

For his anticipated appearance at South Point on Sunday, Brooks was joined by a contingent that included his wife, Peggy, USBC Hall of Famer Carol Norman, Professional Women's Bowling Association Hall of Famer Donner Conners, Eagle winner and 2016 USBC **Masters champion Anthony** Simonsen and 2005 Regular All-Events winner Scott Craddock, who also is the general manager at one of Brooks'

bowling centers, Plano Super Bowl in Plano, Texas.

Also in the crowd was Brooks' doubles partner from the 1973 event, Jim Paine, who competed in the tournament 40 times from 1959-2013. The two won their Regular Doubles title with a 1,337 performance that year in Syracuse, New York.

Brooks now will take his momentum across the South Point property Monday for doubles and singles at the South Point Bowling Center, where he'll have six games to continue his climb up the career pinfall list, a who's who of bowling greats, topped by fellow Texan Bill Lillard Sr. with a 124,087 total.

The championship round will feature a best-of-five Baker final in each division.

Indiana Tech and Martin Methodist are making their ITC debuts in the men's division.

today. While the SMART fund is approaching \$100 million, each year Recipients only request about \$5 million in scholarships annually. Data shows many Recipient scholarships are not used, expire and recycle and, based on an ongoing research project and SMART historical trends, USBC projects 40% of the SMART fund never will be used under the current policy.

Currently, when a USBC Youth athlete (Recipient) earns a scholarship in a competition, the event operator (Provider) deposits the funds in SMART and, when the Recipient attends college, he or she will request the funds be paid directly to the school. SMART places the largest portion of the scholarships in conservative securities, with remaining assets invested in a diversified portfolio expected to yield larger returns, and each year any investment earnings plus expired Recipient scholarships are available for Provider as Unassigned funds to be used for new scholarships.

The proposed policy revisions include splitting future allocations of investment gains and expired Recipient scholarships between new Unassigned funds for Providers use and

added scholarship funds directly to Recipients.

The allocation to Recipients will send 50% of additional funds to active Recipients who have requested funds during the calendar year while 25% will be added to all Recipient accounts as new scholarships, with the percentage based on the amount in the account. The remaining 25% will go toward grants with the criteria, including eligibility, established by the SMART Oversight Committee.

The USBC SMART Committee also is seeking to have the annual expiration date of funds not used by Recipients be moved from the end of the year to Feb. 14, so those funds can be allocated with any possible income distribution. It also has proposed allowing Recipients, after they reach age 21 and before the funds expire, the ability to transfer their scholarship funds to another family member who meets the IRS definition of a 529 plan family member beneficiary. To qualify, transfer Recipients must have at least four (4) years of USBC bowling history and they may not surpass eight-years from their high school graduation
