## Randy Summers, Rodney Black, Jay Nephew Win SASBA Age Bracket at Emerald

HOUSTON, TX - In the 50-59 division of the Age Bracket tournament at Emerald Bowl in Houston, Jay Nephew started qualifying on Saturday, April 24 with a 300 game and never looked back.

He led wire-to-wire including winning 5 of his 8 matches on Sunday for the victory.

It was Jay's third SASBA

title.

Rick Benard finished 2nd, Butch Cormier 3rd, Lee Lorts 4th and Derek Williams 5th.

In the 60-69 group, Rodney Black led after Saturday. He won 6 of his 8 matches Sunday for his first SASBA title.

Ken Gullette claimed 2nd, Donald Robinson 3rd, Pete Seibel 4th and Richard Turner 5th.

In the 70 and over group, Mike Lynch led the qualifying, but fell back on Sunday.

Randy Summers and Gene Rivers both held the lead at different times with Gene having a 63 pin lead going into the 8th and final game.

It was close going into the 10th frame with Gene leaving an unfortunate 4-7-10.

## Zavala Wins First Career Title at PWBA Greater Cleveland Open

PARMA HEIGHTS, Ohio - When Stephanie Zavala of Downey, California, decided to become a member of the Professional Women's Bowling Association, she listed winning the PWBA Rookie of the Year award as her top goal.

It didn't take long for Zavala to become a front-runner for

the award in the 2021 season after capturing her first career PWBA Tour title Saturday at the PWBA Greater Cleveland Open.

Zavala defeated Bryanna Coté of Tucson, Arizona, in the championship match at Yorktown Lanes, 247-216, to claim the title in just her third tournament as a tour member.

The victory, broadcast live on BowlTV.com, earned Zavala the \$10,000 top prize.

After an excellent start to the title tilt, Coté finished the match first, with a chance to roll 248 to force Zavala to toss all three strikes in her final frame to tie the match. Coté rolled a strike in the ninth frame but left a 3-6 combination and missed the spare to give Zavala a chance to mark in the final stanza for the win.

Zavala stepped up in her final frame and calmly struck on her first shot to become the sixth different champion of the 2021 PWBA Tour season.

"This feels incredible," said Zavala, who was a member of Team USA and Junior Team USA in 2017. "My heart was beating out of my chest. I put myself in that position. I knew I wanted to finish, and I wanted to be that last one on the approach. So, I just took a deep breath and said, 'hit, smack, post your shot, everything's going to be all right.'"

Zavala entered the match as the No. 1 seed after posting a six-game block of 1,484 during

## Just Paying Attention

After Anthony Neuer slowed down the internet with the first nationally televised 7 - 10 split conversion in thirty years in his U.S. Open semifinal loss to Jakob Butturff, that brought to mind a theory I've been working on since it first time it was done in 1980. Using physics, players over the years have provided a little bit of light on how to, at worst, bounce pins in the pit either to the other side of the pit or back onto the lane.

Starting with the now four 7 - 10 split conversions on national television, then with the various conversions on PBA XtraFrame and FloBowling, there appears to be a pattern -- faster ball speed and much slower ball rotation, more miles

power hour (MPH) and less revolutions per minute (RPM) seem to be a key. Higher rev rates rotate the pins toward the lane and pit sooner. Lower rev rates make them fly and bounce through a simple transfer of energy.

These factors increase the chance to bounce a 10 pin out of the pit directly off the back curtain. A more recent example

### Jacqui Reese Will Rank Right Up There One Day With Shannon Pluhowsky

What's that? You never heard of Shannon Pluhowsky? Or Jacqui Reese? For those that rarely frequent the events conducted by the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA), you may have never heard of the quiet and unassuming Shannon Pluhowsky, who has obliterated the individual scoring records for women in the United States Bowling Congress (USBC). She has recorded the most 300's (66), the most 800's for three games (65), and three of the top five all time averages in history, including a 250 in 2017.

What Jacqui Reese has accomplished, at the tender age of 36, is almost as impressive.

familiar (and available online for your own examination) is Sean Lavery Spahr's 8 – 10 conversion in the opening match of the 2019 PBA Tournament of Champions TV finals.

Unlike others, this conversion had not one, but two prequels. After leaving a 10 pin in the first frame, the spare ball kicked the pin off the back cushion on the fly, running back up the 10 pin gutter just in front of the sweep. In the third frame after another 10 pin leave, the spare ball once again kicked the pin off the back cushion on the fly, but this time the pin flew over the 8 pin spot on the pin deck.

With those two spare shots in mind, I knew there was a chance something could happen. Ironically, it would be the very next frame, the fourth frame of the match on Lane 28. This time, Lavery Spahr didn't use the plastic spare ball, opting to leave the removable thumb insert in the strike ball. With a given more amount of ball speed than rev rate for a strike ball keeping the pin airborne to get it to the cushion on the fly and back to the pin deck after bouncing on the shaker board on the pit floor, the ejected pin was back on the lane.

Like many of my peers, I never gave a thought about the method to the madness there

was any way possible to pick up a 7 – 10 until Mark Roth stunned opponent Bill Straub and millions watching on national television. Each time after leaving it in the following years, I would throw at the 10 pin hoping to at least kick it over to the 7 pin side of the pit (Straub recounted his thoughts on watching his match win suddenly disappear in a JPA piece several years ago.).

After almost ten years of seriously trying, I finally picked it up. I was a little miffed about leaving one in the middle of a higher scoring stretch while feeling strong of body movement to the foul line. On the spare attempt, the ball actually fell of my thumb a little and hardly applying lift and rotation, similar to a baseball knuckleball pitch, except with good direction. As I watched the ball and traced its path down the lane, the right side of the ball was even with the right edge of the 10 pin. Sure enough, that lack of rotation kicked the pin to the back cushion on the fly nearly in the corner, bouncing off the shaker board, causing the neck of the pin to catch the back edge of the lane (along the tail plank for those who have seen a pindeck up close) rolling the belly of the pin toward the 7 pin.

That was on the Brunswick A2 pinsetter. There have been two more on A2's, three on AMF 82-70's and one on a Brunswick GS-96. Two of the

three on the 82-70's surprised me as the ejected pin bounced off the sweep, before deflecting into the 7 pin, the second of those at a PBA Regional Players Championship. I had previously thought the Brunswick A2 was the easier pinsetter to convert the split due to the movement of the shaker board, shuttling pins away from the lane to the pin wheel.

There is much more hard material by the back cushion of an 82-70 while the GS-96 and newer models are tougher to get a lucky pin bounce. This pinsetter has a hanging piece of vinyl material in front of the back cushion, designed to absorb more flying pin energy. Although not impossible, this is the hardest of the three

sive. The mother of three from Freeland, Pennsylvania, has accumulated 32 perfect 300 games, fifteen 800's and a top average of 240 during league play. Needless to say, whenever her name is mentioned among the elite on the PWBA tour, you can be sure that Jacqui Reese commands the respect of a seasoned veteran.

Among her many local accolades, Reese has won both the New Jersey and Pennsylvania State All Events Titles, in addition to the Pennsylvania State Queens Event. She has a high three game set of 858 (269-289-300) in league play, recorded at Bel Pike Lanes in Belvidere, New Jersey, in 2008. Reese has recorded all-time record three game sets at Bel Pike, Coplay Saegerbund in Pennsylvania (846), Holy Family Club of Nazareth in Pennsylvania (816), and Oakwood Lanes in New Jersey (814, when she was

pinsetters to throw pins in the pit and back onto the lane. As Neuer demonstrated, he got his 10 pin to fly up off the lane, off the sidewall while still flying up, then off the rod holding the hanging curtain before it took out the 7 pin.

Looking at the three prior television conversions, the first hit pin flew at least parallel before hitting the back cushion or hardware holding the back cushion. The 1991 Jess Stay-rook and 1980 Roth conversions both on A2's, both bounced the first pin off the back cushion then the pit floor before it hit the other pin. The 1991 John Mazza conversion on an AMF 82-70 had the 7 pin fly off the lane to the back cushion and

still a youth bowler).

Did you notice that she's not a one house artist? While on the pro tour she finished in the 5th place spot a couple of times (while 5 months pregnant), and came close to the televised finals two other times in Detroit (2015) and Rochester (2017), placing sixth in those events. Jacqui has been managing Spare Times Lanes in Tamaqua, Pennsylvania, for her father Bill Reese the better part of the past ten years.

However, when the COVID-19 hysteria struck, and with three children under the age of five to look after, Jacqui made the difficult decision to leave the temporarily shuttered bowling center and accept a position with the United States Postal Service. In like fashion, Pluhowsky last year chose to forgo the rigors of the women's professional tour and accept the position of Assistant Head Coach for the University of Nebraska bowling program.

After graduating from the University of Nebraska in 2004,

back on the lane on the fly.

According to the USBC Equipment and Specifications manual page 45 at bowl.com, there is a 25" minimum distance from the inside edge of the tail plank to the back cushion. On the GS series pinsetter the hanging curtain is 14.75" from the tail plank. If you've worked on any of the three pinsetters as I have done over the years, there is a surprising amount of room there is in the pit area and looks farther than that, perhaps 30 inches. Looking at the whole pit area, there has to be he right amount of several forces to get a pin to bounce that far that quickly.

The last one I picked up a

Pluhowsky literally tore up the record books of the USBC for the past two decades. While all of her records are impressive, the one that is most astonishing would have to be in the category of 800's. Pluhowsky more than doubles the total of twenty-eight 800's by the runner-up and fellow professional kegler Tish Johnson!

Among Pluhowsky's many 800's was the highest in the land during the 2018 season, an 868 at Bowl 10 in Fairborn, Ohio (289-299-280). She is also distinguished by having represented the United States as a Team USA member 18 times.

the fourth qualifying round to surge ahead of Coté, who previously held the lead. It was the highest block by any competitor during that round.

Coté, the 2021 ITRC Classic champion, led three of the four qualifying rounds and was looking to become the first two-time winner this season.

She began the match with a spare, followed by three consecutive strikes, and looked to be in firm control.

After a strike to open her first career championship-round appearance, Zavala left a 2-8-10 split on the right lane in the second frame, the lane she chose to finish on as the top seed. Although it was early in the game, it was a key moment because the inexperienced Zavala could've folded and allowed Coté to create an insurmountable lead.

Instead, the 24-year-old right-hander followed with a strike and a spare before rolling five consecutive strikes to force the possibility of a tie. Zavala's maturity, despite her age, was on display, and she used her previous experiences to keep her calm and turn the negative into a positive.

"If you would've asked about a year ago, I would've said, 'oh, no it's over in the second frame,'" said Zavala, who competed collegiately for Sam Houston State. "After that, I told myself to get the count, sit down and take a minute and just stay with it. I liked that lane for a reason. I had to trust myself and my ability. Anything can happen, so make it work, and I did."

Zavala was set to compete on the PWBA Tour in 2020, but the tour was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Although heartbroken she wasn't able to compete, Zavala quickly went back to work.

That additional preparation just may have been the difference on Saturday.

"It broke my heart a little bit, and I think it did that for a lot of girls that were getting ready," Zavala said. "You either take that and say it's not meant to be or say, 'hey, I have one more year to perfect my craft, and I can work harder and be more prepared when that time comes.' That's exactly what I did. I practiced a lot. I feel I was more prepared this year, than if I had started last year."

Coté, the No. 2 seed, called her performance last week at the PWBA Lincoln Open

few years ago was on one of Emerald Bowl A2 pinsetters during league put the biggest smile on my face. After telling teammates Delvric Tezeno and Billy Titus my theory, I left a 7 - 10. Sitting literally feet from me while I stood on the approach to shoot the split, I could hear one say to the other he thought I was going to pick it up. After the spare shot left my hand, that magic feel of the ball off my hand registered. As the ball got down the lane, I dropped to one knee, as if I was

calling my shot. I had done this before on a similar feel of the release, resulting on kicking the 10 pin with a rapid speed over to the 7 pin side of the lane without success. But this time, the 10 bounced off the back cushion, then off the floor of the pit and back onto the lane, this time picking it up. As the 10 bounced back on the lane to knock over the 7 pin, I could hear Delvric and Billy laughing out loud as I stood up from the knee bend at the foul line, saying I called my shot months ago.

Easier and tougher can be consider misnomers to fully describe the "win the lottery"

type odds to pick up a 7-10 split, or splits with pins along the back two rows. So maybe lesser rotating faster traveling slower rotating ball theory does have some validity. If your center has scoring software capability to set up spares, give it a try and see for yourself.

FloBowling recapped 7 - 10 split conversions in one of its "Friday Five" video segment last year, but could further detail in a separate piece what I've just explained while showing the pin deck and pit dimensions explaining the "win the lottery" chances. Don't hold your breath.
