## Taylor Breaks Through for Win at New Mexico Open

Rio Rancho, NM - Dylan Taylor, of Scottsdale, AZ, has unexpectedly added his name to the list of champions at the 17th New Mexico Open tournament, held recently at Tenpins \& More in Rio Rancho.

In doing so, he beat three opponents, including two-time US Open champion, Francois Lavoie twice to capture the title and \$ 11,000 first prize from a strong starting field of more than 190 bowler/athletes from thirteen states and Canada.

To even make it to the top four championship round, Taylor beat Tyler Albracht of Amarillo, TX 424-388 in a twogame match, Dennis Brown of Colorado Springs, CO 400-381 and John McIntyre of Pueblo,

## Jillian Martin Makes History with Win at 2021 PWBA BowlTV Classic

ARLINGTON, Texas - Junior Team USA member Jillian Martin of Stow, Ohio, made history Tuesday night by becoming the youngest bowler to win a Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour event.

The 17-year-old phenom defeated England's Verity Crawley in the title match of the 2021 PW BA BowITV Classic, 221-188, to claim the $\$ 10,000$ top prize and a place in the bowling record book.

The BowITV Classic was held at the International Training and Research Center as part of the four-event PW BA Summer Classic Series, and all rounds of competition were broadcast live on BowITV.

Martin, who celebrated her birthday on July 25, bested the 35-year-old mark set by PW BA and United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Wendy Macpherson, when she won the 1986 U.S. Women's Open as an 18-year-old high school senior.
"I was very nervous going into that match, but I reminded myself how special it was to have an opportunity to win a tournament against the best ladies in the world," Martin said. "I wanted to make the most of it and have some fun. I kept telling myself that the whole match. I made a couple bad shots, but it was incredible to have that opportunity and be able to find success at the highest level."

The loss was Crawley's second runner-up finish of the Summer Classic Series, and sixth since joining the PWBA in 2017, but she did break through for her first PW BA Tour title at the 2021 Greater Nashville Open in June.


She started Tuesday's title tilt with a pair of strikes, before back-to-back washouts in the third and fourth frames left her in a hole she could not climb out of.

In the championship match of the PW BA International Bowling Campus Classic on Saturday, she fell to Jen Higgins of Lew is Center, Ohio, 252-155.

Though Crawley won't leave Arlington with a trophy, she did make her way into the race for PW BA Player of the Year. She's now second on the 2021 PW BA points list behind Julia Bond of Aurora, Illinois, who has won two titles this year.
"It has been a phenomenal few weeks," said Crawley, a 27-year-old right-hander who was the only bowler to make the cut in all three Summer Classic Series events. "If you would've told me coming into this that it would turn out this way, I 100\% would've walked away completely satisfied with those finishes. I'm very proud of myself and how I competed each event and how I stayed mentally strong."

After sparing a 10 pin in
her first frame back under the BowITV lights, Martin struck in six of her next seven frames to put the match out of reach.

Not only did Martin help herself to the brink of history Monday and Tuesday, she also set herself up for a chance at redemption.

At the 2021 PW BA Kickoff Classic Series in January, Martin found herself in a similar position, when she earned a meeting with Bryanna Coté in the title match of the PWBA ITRC Classic. Unfortunately, it wasn't Martin's time, and Coté won the game, 244-238.
"I made good shots last time against Bryanna and bowled the best game I could to give myself a chance, and while it was a hard loss, I learned from it and wanted to come back from it," Martin said. "I knew I'd be back out here competing at some point in time, but I didn't know it would be this soon. I figured that whenever that time came, I'd try to be the best I could be and take advantage of the opportunity."

As TBN returns to weekly editions, it's time for the annual Troy Walker Media series of columns, focusing on one of the cornerstones of JPA, that is how bowling is perceived by the outside media and what can be done to further blend and grow bowling's exposure.

The series is named for the legendary video clip of Troy Walker from the 2013 Luci Doubles going for a 300 game when the sweep inadvertently dropped literally in front of the
ball as it was about to enter the pin deck for what could have been a 300 game. Instead, the clip became the first viral video clip, appearing in places bowling had never been seen before, like national broadcast network television news and talk shows, wacky morning radio shows, and many other places online. Since that video had over two million views in several days, I've taken you behind the scenes of who really watches sports on television and the

ratings systems used to measure audiences, and what it was like to broadcast the 2017 Luci Doubles on PBA XtraFrame.

This year I'm going to explain how professional bowling and professional bowlers use sports marketing and how well each has adapted to the early 21st century model

Marketing is one way of bringing attention and making others aware of a brand. For instance, you have gotten used to how Pro sports leagues promote their teams...Come to so and so Park or Field and watch our home team battle the visiting team. Come out as we take on our archrival tomorrow in a key game. Want to know how so and so catches the ball so well? Since using our glove, he became a multi time Gold Glove winner.

For bowling, it's...Want to know how so and so strikes so much and makes many more television finals and wins more tournaments? He/she uses this brand of ball.

Notice something missing here? In the evolution of the internet and social media in the last two decades, with few exceptions, individual athletes have been much more active in marketing their own brand and name by promoting themselves on various websites and social media platforms.

In the middle part of last century, bowling ball manufacturers would send their ball staff professionals out to exhibitions and clinics across the country for weeks at a time, not only to show off the latest equipment, but also what were essentially the first learn to bowl classes.

Before he became a Houston area bowling proprietor, the late USBC Hall of Famer Don Ellis told me on several occasions of his trips as a member of the Brunswick Advisory Staff. He and Brunswick both shared the idea was to interact

with the buying public in groups to keep the company name at the forefront of bowlers. Remember, this was the time when national media exposure was done through movies, newspapers, radio, and magazines. Television was in its infancy and not everyone had a television set yet. And for bowling, buying a ball was done much less frequent than today.

Fast forward ten years into the late 1950's and television ads were added to overall marketing campaigns showing the latest equipment, including a new-fangled piece of equipment known as pinsetters. Many smaller centers were still staffed by pinboys for the next few years as both AMF 82-30's and Brunswick A2's fully automatic machines became commonplace. Keep in mind in the post World War 2 era, there was a tremendous push for the bigger, better, and wherever the next great leap of technology would head.

This was when bowling became one of the first television sports. At this point, individual bowlers came to be more marketable to equipment companies, both of balls and pinsetters.

With individual tournaments and made for TV shows being tel evised, like J ack pot Bowling, Make That Spare, and Championship Bowling, audiences started to see the faces of its big stars more frequently, mainly Don Carter and Dick Weber.

At the time, Carter was on Brunswick staff, Weber with AMF. Both were giving

exhibitions showing off each company's pinsetters while giving exhibitions. Carter was one of the first athletes to make a six-figure income through investments and other endorsements outside the bowling world with Viceroys, Palmolive Rapid Shave, Wonder Bread, and later in the 1970's as the lone bowler in the famed Miller Lite beer ads.

In 1964, Ebonite signed Carter to the first big money sports endorsement deal, the famed ten-year \$1 million endorsement contract, which included the introduction of its Gyro Balanced Ball. It used his signature with the engraved Gyro symbol, used on many Ebonite balls until only a few years ago. Also included was the Don Carter glove with the palm pad, (the one Mark Roth

## 20mate <br> Jef Goodger and the Bowlers of the Lost Art

I always enjoy reading J ef Goodger's editorial in Bowlers Journal International, and the July edition did not disappoint. The title of his article was Decoding the Language of Topography, and was focused on a bowler's ability to conquer lane conditions.

It suddenly dawned upon me that my geographic training in school may have provided an insight into bowling that I had never contemplated before... topography! My first introduction to topographic maps was at about age 13, at the Carnegie Library in my hometown of Sebastopol, California. An older patron most likely showed me how to use the stereoscope glasses over a pair of map images, making two dimensional images come to life in the brain as a third dimension!

For those of you that may never have experienced this phenomenon, I highly recommend visiting your local library or institution of learning (high school or college) to see if you can witness this imaging first-hand. The best way that I can describe the adventure of topographic map exploration is this: imagine that you are looking at Google Maps (either terrain or satellite imaging) and the hills, valleys, mountains and buildings miraculously
"pop up" out of the map!
Without realizing it at the time, my ability to "read the Ianes" while rolling all of those 300 games during my college years, before the onslaught of high scores began to proliferate the bowling scene, was possibly from my college training as a geography major at Sonoma State University. It all makes perfect sense to me now, almost 50 years after the fact, following the reading of J ef's article about decoding the lanes.

Goodger, in his customary utilization of double entendres, so reminiscent of the famous ten-pin bowling writer Chuck Pezzano, provides a few examples to explain his topic of decoding lane topography:

1) The topography is pretty good here. The lanes aren't perfectly flat, but they're close.
2) The Ianes are tricky. The Ianes favor that other guy's ball more than mine.
3) Every pair is different. This is not a fun place to bowl 4) Every Iane is different. This is the worst place that I've ever bowled.

Isn't it interesting on today's Pro Bowlers Tour that the lane condition is actually telegraphed to the competitors with the appearance of a blue oil substance upon the surface of the lane? Can you imagine how easy it would have been back in the day to line up, especially when moving after each game? I find it interesting that most bowlers, with the exception of some of the older competitors (Norm Duke, Chris Barnes, etc.), don't even use the oil line that is provided to direct their ball to the pocket. It's as if the overreaction of the bowling balls has negated the advantage of the "block" condition that is evident to everyone with a color television.

Carrying that a step further, it's also interesting that some of the top pros have resorted to using urethane once again, to control the overreaction caused by the reactive bowling balls. As color commentator Randy Pedersen has often mentioned, the "rev" rate of the bowling ball has now become as important as the angle of entry provided by the big hook. Top players that come to mind in regard to the switch to ureth ane are J esper Svensson of Vimmerby, Sweden, with 10 PBA Titles; Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas, with 8 PBA Titles; and Jakob Butturff of Chandler, Arizona, with 7 PBA Titles.

Many times, I have mentioned that when I initially joined AMF, it was an opportunity for me to see the world and to discover many of the geographic sites that I had witnessed in books and classroom films. This was indeed true, but little did I realize until perusing J ef Goodger's article, Decoding the Language of Topography, that my good fortune had begun many years earlier, when the natural and physical features of a bowling lane popped up like a topographic map under the lens of stereoscope glasses, and allowed me to visualize the lane in 3D!!

Shot with what looks like random cell phone video of open bowlers wearing 1950's style bowling shirts, viewers

Dance with what brung ya! What to do when you left part of your game at home Ever felt that way? I arrived at a tournament once and discovered I had forgotten my left side spare game at home. It was as if I had never shot a left side spare in my life. The lane looked all off. I knew I usually stood over here and threw over there but it was all wonky and I couldn't get the feel. And then there was the time with one and half games to go and I'm the bubble, the thumb slug falls dow $n$ into the thumbhole.

Maybe today is the day it feels like you are pushing every shot outside. Actually, that was in the first two games. Now it feels like you couldn't get the ball to the outside unless you faced six lanes away. Whose ball is in your bag anyhow?

Stuff happens. You'll have to go with what you brought today. It is no different than bringing your bag into the center and opening it only to discover you've brought the wrong bag. As soon as the panic subsides,you just move around until you find a place where the equipment you brought will work.

By the way, this is not an opportunity to gripe about the lanes. You never have permission for that. It's not the lanes' fault you brought the wrong bag. I think you should practice this scenario, actually. It's one of the best ways to find how deep you can dig to find the versatile and creative bowler in you. In fact, sometimes you discover you didn't bring the wrong bag at all. What you brought was the wrong idea...

Anyway, what usually happens in that "There's no shot out here tonight" situation is that we determinedly keep throwing where we W ERE effective, thinking the magic will be back in just a second. We're sure the shot WAS there which means it IS there. Maybe not. The reality is that what you are doing isn't working.

What the ball did last frame on this lane has not much to do with this frame. Don't judge. Observe. This moment says that in order to get the ball to the outside you need to face six Ianes away. Okay, so do it. Facing six lanes away cannot possibly be any more embarrassing than the last few shots you've attempted.

At that tournament where I realized I had not brought my old, dependable left side spare game with me, it was time to get radical. So, radical for me at the time was to stand on the left side of the lane and throw dow $n$ the boards at left side spares. It felt a little awkward but was certainly no worse than the foreign territory of the right side of the lane! It worked and I learned about alternative thinking and panic attacks and getting in ruts and all kinds of things from that experience. It's always about the learning.

Anyway, the point is that you fix what you can fix during competition and when you or your stuff can't be repaired right then, you go with the flow and try something different. You'll always learn something, even if it is to mark your bags more carefully. Learning what not to do is just as important as learning what to do. See ya' at strikeability.com!

at that event, and the PW BA Kickoff Classic Series it was a part of, that earned her a special exemption into the Summer Classic Series from USBC and the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America.

# Team USA Accepting Applications for 2021 IBF Para Bowling World Championships and IBF Masters World Championships 

ARLINGTON, Texas - The Team USA program is accepting resumes from eligible senior bowlers and para bowlers interested in representing the United States at the 2021 International Bowling Federation World Championships in November

Bowlers of all ages and skill levels will converge on the Dubai International Bowling Center in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, from Nov. 3-26 for the IBF Super World Championships (adult men and women), IBF Para Bowling World Championships and IBF M asters (formerly Senior) World Championships.

Participants for the Super World Championships (Nov. 6 -15) will be chosen from the 2021 Team USA roster, but representatives for the inaugural Para Bowling World Championships (Nov. 12-16) and M asters World Championships (Nov. 18-26) will be selected by the

National Selection Committee from the submitted applications, which will be accepted through Sept. 6.

The committee will select two men and two women to compete in the W 1 category of the Para World Championships. Participants will compete for medals in singles, doubles, mixed team and most valuable (formerly all-events)

The W1 Para/Amputee Classification incorporates all wheelchair classifications. It includes leg amputees, cerebral palsy (with functional hands), and Les Autres athletes with mobility disfunction. All must compete from a wheelchair and follow the rules of play and modified rules established for this discipline.

The committee will select four men and four women, age 50 and older, to compete in the 50+ division of the Masters World Championships. Medals

will be awarded for singles, doubles, team, mixed team and most valuable athlete/ federation.

To be eligible for this opportunity with Senior Team USA, athletes must be, or turn, 50 years old during the 2021 calendar year.

The M asters World Championships also will include a 65+ category, but the United States will not field a team.

Those selected will receive a paid entry into the events, airfare, lodging and official uniforms.

## Danielle McEwan Wins Second Title of Season at 2021 PWBA Spokane Open

SPOKANE, Wash. - Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, locked up her second title of the 2021 Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour season with a strike in her final frame Saturday at the PW BA Spokane Open.

The 29-year-old right-hander recorded her seventh career PW BA Tour title with a 203-192 victory over Liz Johnson of Niagara Falls, New York, at Lilac Lanes \& Casino.

She claimed $\$ 10,000$ for the victory, and the championship round was broadcast live on BowITV.com.

McEwan needed a mark in the 10th frame to secure the win in the back-and-forth title match, and she delivered one of her best shots of the week.

The 10-time Team USA member started the month with a win at the Professional Bowlers Association/ PWBA Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles event in Houston with EJ Tackett of Bluffton, Indiana.
"That shot is literally everything we practice and train for every day," McEwan said. "I knew exactly what I had to do, and I just cleared my mind and let my body do what it knows how to do. Thankfully, the pins fell."

McEwan, who entered the stepladder as the top seed,

started the match against Johnson with a double and recorded spares in the third and fourth frames to build a slight advantage, but she missed a 10 pin in the fifth frame to hand over the lead to the 25 -time PWBA Tour titlist and United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer.

Johnson wasn't able to capitalize on the miscue, how ever, allowing McEwan to showcase her resilience and recapture the lead with strikes in the seventh and eighth frames.
"I was really frustrated after missing that," McEwan said. "I actually missed a couple of them today and handed Liz an
open on a stupid mistake. After that, I really had to buckle down to make sure it didn't cost me."

Johnson stayed clean during the title match, but she was unable to pair any strikes together, recording just three of them in the final.

Finishing the match first, Johnson could have doubled to force McEwan to throw two strikes of her own. Instead, J ohnson left the 3-10 split on her first delivery.

McEwan felt her best look on this week's 45 -foot oil pattern was on the fresh, and she

ARLINGTON, Texas - The winners in each of the four age-based divisions at the 2021 Bowling.com Youth Open Championships have been determined by the International Bowling Campus Youth Development team.

The 2021 Youth Open Championships, a non-qualifying tournament open to all United States Bowling Congress Youth members, was contested at All Star Bowl in Indianapolis and held July 7-9, 16-18 and 24-25.

Bowlers in the 18 -and-under, 15 -and-under, 12-and-under and 10-and-under divisions competed for scholarship prizes and national titles in four-player team, doubles, singles and all-events.

Each discipline featured a scratch and optional handicap division, with 830 bowlers and 174 teams participating in the 2021 edition.

Breaking down the numbers from All Star Bowl, the 2021 tournament was highlighted by a group of young athletes finding success in several events, with 22 players claiming multiple titles. From that group of champions, six recorded victories in three events and a pair of bowlers each won four titles.

Additionally, 13 bowlers captured a win at the Youth Open Championships for the second consecutive time, with five of those competitors now having claimed at least one victory in each of their last three visits to the event.

The 2020 tournament was canceled due to COVID-19.

The members of Here Comes Trouble, this year's U12 Handicap Team champion, took home the most hardware in 2021, combining for 14 wins in Indianapolis.

Lindsay Greim of Poway, California, and Jon Verde of Las Vegas each recorded four victories, while Bella Castillo of Odessa, Texas, and Macey Bates of Fremont, Nebraska, each won three titles.

Along with the team win with a 2,652 handicap total, Lindsay paired with Bella to win U12 Scratch Doubles $(1,142)$ and added victories in the girls division of U12 Scratch Singles (540) and U12 Scratch All-Events $(1,668)$.

Bella also was the cochampion in U12 Handicap All-Events with a 2,217 total, which gives the pair 11 wins in their last two appearances at the Youth Open Champion ships. They won a doubles title in 2019 (U10 Scratch Doubles), while Lindsay captured the top spot in U10 Scratch Singles and Bella won U10 Scratch All-Events.
