

ROWLETT, Texas - The Inaugural TX Ironman lived up to it's name as 78 bowlers took the lanes at 9am Saturday, August 29 at Rowlett Bowl-a-Rama to embark on a 16 game journey to get to the top 8 single elimination bracket finals. Nathan Bohr led the field with 3711, just barely ahead of Billy Rogers, 3707, who claimed the top position for most of the day.

and social media reputation on top of that. We respond to all reviews, both good and bad," Tim said.





Bowling and the mainstream media—that phrase alone has been enough to raise more red flags than I care to count over the history of this column and even before.

But lately, there has been a different approach to these items seen nationally, especially now that these items can be reviewed in a library on a media outlet's website.

The latest piece was a rather pleasant surprise on my birthday several weeks ago as

PWBA player Gazmine "GG" Mason was profiled in a five minute segment on ABC-TV's "Good Morning America." The surprise I am referring to features a reporter with a previously unknown background in the sport. After hearing of GG's story of wanting to inspire more young female African American bowlers to compete in college, for Team USA, and professionally, lead anchor Robin Roberts reported the story, adding she was a Missis-

sippi youth bowling champion.

I cannot stress enough when a reporter has a background in our little corner of the world, the angle of the story almost guarantees a more realistic presentation of the joy and satisfaction the game and what it could bring to others.

After a sit-down interview, Roberts grabbed a house ball, a pair of house shoes, and bowled a game with Mason, where the brief shots of Roberts rolling the ball show her state champion form. Another part of the surprise came as Roberts asked relevant questions about Mason's career thus far, nearly a path the former college basketball player and ESPN SportsCenter anchor almost took herself.

Keeping in mind five minutes on national television is a very long time, but this is easily one of the better features showing off the game and the people who are able to bowl at the highest levels.

Another television news story about bowling aired in the bowling hotbed of Milwaukee showing how safe this activity once the weather turns colder (as it does much more so north of the Ohio River than the Red River of the South). Titled "Is Bowling Safe?" the Fox6Milwaukee WakeUp show spoke with OnMilwaukee.com reporter Molly Snyder about the financial hit centers took closing six weeks before the winter season was completed, comparing it to retailers losing out on December sales. She mentioned centers traditionally closing for the summer (again, more so north of the Ohio River),

keeping open bowling groups separated by an empty lane, but center air ventilation is the biggest concern. Snyder added she is an avid open bowler, even attending a Milwaukee high with its own lanes.

As 2020-21 season leagues kick off this week, a big question is how each center is handling social distancing. For example, at Cherry Lanes in Dubuque, Iowa, with a majority of leagues normally fill the house four nights a week, teams scheduled on odd numbered lanes will bowl three games on its pair of lanes at 6:00pm. After the prescribed and mandated cleaning of the all the bowling furniture, the

even numbered teams will bowl at 7:30pm without a re oil. Both teams will bowl on its pair of lanes, but not at the same time. Smaller leagues not normally taking the whole center will spread out with each team on a single pair of lanes with all teams bowling at the same time.

The Dubuque City Council passed a mask mandate on August 6th requiring face masks to be worn inside any public buildings. Masks are necessary off the approach and in the center, optional while on the approach, much like it is in Harris County, the City of Houston, and numerous other places.

Fox Sports Increases PBA League Coverage to Six Two-Hour LIVE Telecasts

New York, NY – The 2020 PBA League officially returns to the lanes in September with 60 of the world's best male, female, and international athletes competing for the prestigious Elias Cup.

This year, the PBA League is making history with 12 teams, including four expansion franchises and two all-women's teams. This year's telecast will also feature four additional hours of live coverage on FS1.

The twelve teams now split into two divisions, Carter and Anthony, will take to the lanes on Friday September 26th with the Portland Lumberjacks looking to defend their title.

The PBA League will also have a new home in 2020 – Bowlero Centreville in Centreville, VA, just outside of Washington, DC.

After months of consideration, the Professional Bowlers Association, in conjunction with the original host center, Bayside Bowl in Portland Maine, made the decision to move the event due to current statewide COVID 19 related

bowling career with 20 PBA wins (still 16th most today on the all-time list) and a legacy of developing a new teaching method of the game.

Three of those wins are in TBN's coverage area. His first win was the 1966 Fort Worth **Open at Meadowbrook Lanes** on East Lancaster Ave. in Fort Worth, defeating Bobby Cooper. Two years later, Pelican Lanes at Veterans Boulevard and Lake Ave. in Metairie, Louisiana was host to his fifth PBA title, a 239 to 179 win over Don Helling for the New Orleans Lions Open. San Antonio's Wonder Bowl off Austin Hwy. was the site of his 20th and final tour win in a 1979, a 211 to 202 decision over Neil Burton.

His two notable runner-up finishes bookended the 1970's in the PBA Firestone Tournament of Champions. His 268 title-match effort was the highest losing score on national television for many years to Don Johnson's legendary 299 game in 1970. His final television appearance was his 224 to 195 loss to George Pappas, who led the 1979 ToC from start to finish.

Most bowlers these days remember Ritger's Bowling Camps, featuring multi-day format featuring proven teaching methods developed



restrictions.

Unlike other PBA events requiring much less detail, there was a red carpet walk-up before there is no way to recreate the BoPo atmosphere with fans this year."

A silver lining for fans – the PBA League will return to Bayside Bowl in 2021.

General admission ticket holders will receive an email from Bayside Bowl with information to receive a full refund or have their tickets roll over to 2021.

Add in all the local television stations, online outlets, and area newspapers wanting to talk with Chris Paul, James Harden, Mookie Betts, and numerous others, getting a spot in media row was a little tricky. But Jerry made sure each of us got what we needed, and that story, one of a dozen or so I penned for BJI, was the cover story several months later.

I've written this here before, but it was Bill who was the first to notice my work and present it to a national audience. All I had asked for was a critique and review of a concept I'd had since the mid 80's. In the third ever JPA in 1998, I premiered the first Top 25 TV Bowling Moments list (sorry it doesn't have a catchier name or abbreviation). Much to my shock six months later, Bill wrote back he was publishing it in ABC's quarterly "Bowling" Magazine, turning the radio and TV guy into a nationally published writer. Thank you, Bill, and enjoy your retirement. ######

Trying to Make the Ball Do Something

As nice as it would be to think you're in charge, you're not. The lane is the boss and your ball the only ping you have for what the lane wants. To think you can "make" the ball do anything can get you in trouble.

Yes, there are hand and wrists positions that will allow you to change the way the ball interacts with the lane. I'm talking about the notion that if your curving ball isn't, you can "fix" that by really coming around it or jacking up your wrist brace, for example.

Worse, you might note the ball worked in practice and now it doesn't so it must be that you need to do more of something, less of something, move up on the approach a $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, speed up, slow down, or change seats in the bowler's area, to get it to act like it did in practice. Thinking that since the ball was drilled to go long and snap that it will always go long and snap is unrealistic. Trying to get the ball to do what you want instead of what the lane wants simply won't work.

Once you've found a zone to play, how long can you play there? Well, that depends on how many people are playing there, what type of equipment they're using, the topography, what type of oil is being used, (the higher the viscosity of the oil, the slicker it will play, for example).

Temperature affects the behavior of oil dramatically. To quote Steve Jensen, "... higher temperatures mean more friction, all else being equal. That is simply another affect of oil viscosity - as temperature increases, viscosity decreases, leading to more friction be-

tween ball and lane surface. I think this is partly why the fable about oil 'evaporating' in high temperatures is so prevalent. People notice the lanes have more friction when it's hot and attribute that (incorrectly) to oil evaporating. Really, though, this is caused by the oil viscosity getting reduced due to an increase in temperature leading to higher friction, even though the same amount of oil is applied with the same pattern. The heat vs. viscosity issue can easily be remembered by anyone who cooks. Notice how the cooking oil gets real runny after it is heated, but is much thicker when cool? Same thing applies on a lane."

Oil does not evaporate. If it's cold, the oil won't move as much or as quickly as it does when it's hot. Don't judge the temperature of the center by how hot you are while you're bowling. A more accurate measure of what temperature the oil is responding to would be to check to see if the hundreds of fans watching you bowl are in parkas...

USBC Hall of Famer Dick Ritger dies at age 81

ARLINGTON, Texas - Dick **Ritger, a United States Bowling** Congress Hall of Fame member from River Falls, Wisconsin, died Thursday at his home. He was 81.

Ritger was a two-time titlist at the USBC Open Championships, winning Classic Team in 1967 and Classic All-Events in 1977, and was elected to the USBC Hall of Fame in 1984 in the Superior Performance category.

Also a Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer (1978), Ritger is one of 16 bowlers in history to win 20

professional bowling career spanned 16 years, starting in 1964. He twice was named the

or more PBA Tour titles. His

PBA's Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award winner (1970 and 1973), and his success as a competitor earned him the No. 14 spot on the list of the 50 greatest players in PBA history, published in 2009.

During the PBA's 60th anniversary celebration a decade later, a panel of historians, bowling writers and longtime **PBA Tour competitors reviewed** and ranked the organization's top moments, 1-60.

The No. 1 moment was the 299 game rolled by Don Johnson in the title match of the 1970 Firestone Tournament of Champions, which came

against Ritger.

Ritger began honing his skills at a young age at his family's 10-lane bowling center in Hartford, Wisconsin, and he was able to balance a busy league bowling schedule while completing his time at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse (1960), where he doublemajored in physical education and recreation.

While he did go on to make a name for himself on the lanes in the 1960s and 1970s, he later became one of the world's most accomplished and recognizable coaches.

His educational background helped lead to the creation of Dick Ritger Bowling Camps, and the teaching of his revolutionary Ritger Method has Continued on Page 17


